A LOOK BACK AT LIABILITY

As much as some drivers may contest their contribution to the fault of an automobile accident, there is at least one rule violation about which there is little debate. In virtually all cases, the driver who hits another driver's car from behind is at fault. This is based on the fact that a basic rule of the road holds that a driver be able to stop safely in the event that the vehicle ahead stops, regardless of why it stops. One possible exception to this rule is the case where a car hits the rear-end of the car ahead because it was hit from behind by a third car. In these instances, drivers in the two lead cars should look to fix

liability with the driver of the third car.
