GOING ON RECORD

Whether the legal obligation to report an automobile accident is mandatory or voluntary, it is a good idea to protect yourself by reporting any accident in which you are involved to the police. Even if you find yourself entangled in a seemingly minor fender bender, never agree to keep the incident secret by mutual agreement with the other party. Doing so leaves you open to the possibility that the other party may file a late report that contends he or she suffered an injury. Without a police report documenting each party's version of events, those duped by the other party into thinking that the accident was of little consequence could find themselves

with little to back up their claims.

When you are involved in an automobile accident, either as a driver, a passenger, pedestrian or bicycle rider, it is highly important to take necessary steps to protect your rights. If you have been injured in an auto accident, you may be eligible to receive compensation. For further information, call our office for a free initial consultation. HINT: Generally, a police report must be filed if an auto accident results in personal injury and/or property damage that exceeds a certain dollar amount.
