Employees who are injured on the job are entitled to receive Workers' Compensation benefits. However, this does not mean that injured workers should automatically bypass lawyers when seeking Workers' Compensation benefits. It is often necessary to have outside assistance in making sure that employees get the medical attention/rehabilitative services and consideration they need. Otherwise, they may be vulnerable. According to a recent study by Ohio State University researchers, workers going back to a job with extended working hours after being injured were 81% more likely to be fired and 70% more likely to quit than workers returning to conventional 40-hour-week jobs. Injured employees

have every reason to expect that they get a fair shake from the system.
